Should private law be national?

While internationalisation of society stimulates the emergence of common political and legal frameworks for a better coordination of economic and social relations, the field of law which is devoted to the regulation of those relations – i.e. private law – remains firmly bound to a national level. The seminar aims at unfolding the ideological underpinnings and the cultural-historical foundations of the link between private law and the national idea.
