Virtual Exchange Training for Academic Teachers

Course Overview

This training course is tailored for Higher Education educators and PhD students from any discipline who are interested in integrating class-to-class VE into their academic courses. The course will be conducted on the JDU Moodle platform and accompanied with weekly Zoom meetings.

Course Workload & Format

- Expected weekly workload: approx. 3 hrs (including Zoom sessions)
- Asynchronous Instruction: Delivered through Moodle, allowing you to learn at your own pace.
- Weekly Online Video Meetings: Conducted via Zoom, providing realtime interaction and support. Dates and times are to be determined.
